- On average 1,400 fires per year occur in caravans
- More than five fires a day are started by candles
- Every three days someone dies from a fire caused by a cigarette

GET OUT, STAY OUT and call 999










- Fit a smoke alarm
- Test your smoke alarm once a week and replace batteries imediately if needed
- Don't use cleaning products on a smoke alarm, either wipe with a damp cloth or use a vacuum to clear dust from vents



- Fit a carbon monoxide (CO) detector
- Test your carbon monoxide detector once a week and replace batteries imediately if needed










- · Don't overload plugs
- · Using an adaptor with a lead is safer
- Do not run electrics from one caravan to the other



• Ensure all gas appliances are Gas Safe installed





 Ensure clothes are not next to heaters

- Don't leave naked flames unattended
- Don't put lighters or matches where children can reach









 Smoking inside can be dangerous - smoke outside instead




- NEVER try to extinguish an oil fire with water - it will explode
- Be carefull with liquids around electrics in the kitchen
- NEVER put metalic objects into a microwave













- Keep matches and lighters out of childrens reach
- Never leave cooking unattended that a child could reach


• When gas is in use, keep upright and secure












- Keep gas away from heat sources
- Ensure gas supplies are kept a safe distance away from your caravan



Keep your caravan 6
metres apart where
possible to ensure any
fire cannot spread from
caravan to caravan
